REQUIRED Applied/Academic Courses

- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- French
- Canadian Geography

Open Courses (Choose from three)

- Music, Drama or Visual Arts
- Introduction to Business
- Information and Communication Technology in Business
- Integrated Technology
- Health and Physical Education (**highly recommended)
- Food and Nutrition
- Individual and Family Living

Community Involvement

- Can begin July 2015, right after Grade 8
- Minimum of 40 hours in addition to 30 credits completed over four years
- Broad range of volunteer activities recognized
- Students track volunteer hours and submit to high school guidance department

Grade 10 Literacy Test

- Students will take a literacy test in grade 10 (late March/early April)
- Students must pass the test to graduate
- Achievement is recorded on Ontario Student Record as a pass only
- Based on language and communication expectations of the curriculum, up to and including grade nine
- If student is unable to meet standards in first attempt, remedial help will begin. Student must retake until standard is met or take a Literacy Course.







- Cameron Heights offers an International Baccalaureate (I.B.) Program
- Eastwood Collegiate offers an Integrated Arts Program
- Sir John A. Macdonald S.S. offers the Fast Forward Program
- Waterloo C.I. offers Extended French, and Advanced Strings for current strings students, or those who can demonstrate equivalent experience through audition
- K.C.I. offers a full French Immersion Program, the Fast Forward Program, and Extended French* (*ONLY for students in the SJAM boundary)

Students currently enrolled in French Immersion or Strings at Centennial may continue in those programs where offered. All other students must apply/audition for specialty programs.

Ontario Secondary School Diploma

- 30 Credits (A credit is 110 hrs of successful study in any subject area)
- 18 Compulsory credits or subjects
- 12 Optional credits or elective subjects
- 40 Hours of community involvement
- Successful performance on the grade 10 Literacy Test



Graduation Requirements - Compulsory Credits

- 4 English one credit per grade
- 1 French as a second language (Grade nine)
- 3 Mathematics at least one in grade 11 / 12
- 2 Science
- 1 Canadian History (usually grade ten)
- 1 Canadian Geography (usually grade nine)
- 1 Arts (dance, drama, music, visual arts)
- 1 Health and Physical Education (recommended in grade nine)
- 1 Civics and Career Studies (half credit each, usually done in grade ten)
- 1 of an extra: English, or an additional language or social science and the humanities, or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education, or cooperative education
- 1 of: an extra health and physical education or business studies or the arts, or cooperative education
- 1 of: grade 11 or 12 science or a technology course, or cooperative education

Optional Courses (*may vary slightly school to school)

- The Arts (Visual Arts, Drama, Music)
- Business Studies (Introduction to Business, Information Technology, Accounting, etc.)
- **Technology Education** (Manufacturing, Communications, Computer Engineering, etc.)
- Computer Studies (Grade 10 and up)
- Cooperative Education (Senior Grades)
- Canadian & World Studies (Law, Political Science, Economics Grade 10 and up)
- Additional Languages (Latin, Spanish, German)
- Family Studies (Beginning grade 9)

Any course can be taken after the required number of compulsory credits are accumulated .


